

Student Visa Responsibilities

Your Student Visa, Your Responsibility

As a student visa holder there are certain requirements that must be met. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of your visa.

We **highly** recommend that you read them.



You must meet attendance requirements

- You must attend at least 80% of all scheduled class hours for each semester.
- If you cannot come to class, you must submit documented evidence (e.g. medical certificate) to Student Services.



Meet academic progress requirements:

- You must pass more than 50% of the enrolment load of each semester.
- You must be enrolled in a full-time study load.



Transfer provider (release letter):

Under 18 students (condition 8532):

- If RMIT has approved your accommodation and welfare arrangements, you must not make any changes without RMIT permission (e.g. you must not stay at someone else's house even for one night).



Change of personal details (condition 8533):

- You must update any change of your personal details within 7 days of the change.



Work limitations (condition 8105):

- You must not work more than 40 hours per fortnight during semester.

Meet visa grant requirements (condition 8516):

- You must have sufficient financial capacity to support your study and stay in Australia.
- You must pay your fees by the due date stated in your invoice, otherwise your enrolment will be cancelled for non-payment and you will be reported to DIBP.



Meet Overseas Student Health Insurance requirements (condition 8501):

- You must maintain Overseas Student Health Insurance during your stay in Australia.
