Academic English Guarantee

What is it?

The RMIT English Worldwide (REW) Academic English Guarantee is a progression support module for students studying remotely. Students studying remotely who do not achieve a level at the completion of a 10-week course may be eligible for a free of charge module (5 weeks).

Who is this for?

The conditions for eligibility of the free REW Academic English Guarantee module apply to all students studying remotely. This offer will be available for students studying from 7 September 2020 to 12 March 2021.

Conditions for eligibility

REW offers an Academic English Guarantee progression support module for students studying remotely. Students who do not achieve a level (10 weeks) delivered remotely, but fulfil each of the criteria outlined below, will be eligible for a free of charge support module (5 weeks).

Criteria:

- Attended 95% of classes. This is measured per level (over 10 weeks)
- Submitted / sat all assessment tasks (100% attempted)
- Passed three of the four macro skills (minimum 60% achieved - Credit)
 - Listening / Speaking / Reading / Writing
- Attended and actively participated in a minimum of one Study Success support session (workshop or coaching) per week.

Additional Information:

- Each student can access this offer once per level of study.
- Any instance of connectivity, technical issues, or compassionate considerations that have any impact on meeting the above criteria will be considered for approval by the RMIT Training Executive Director, Academic.
- The free of charge support module will come in the form of a free of charge extension provided at the end of the student's enrollment period (CoE).
- The student must accept the free of charge extension offer in Studylink in order to receive an updated CoE and enrol in the free of charge support module.
- This offer will be applicable for all REW enrollments (new and continuing) in the following modules:

 - **Module 9** (12 October 2020)
 - **Module 10** (16 November 2020)
 - **Module 1** (5 January 2021)
